As I walked into the church this morning I was both shocked and amazed at how well the pots of poinsettias that decorated the church at Christmas are surviving. What is even more shocking is that I came into my office and am writing about the upcoming season of Lent. Yes it is absolutely true! Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 26, 2020.

Each year on Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, the liturgy of the Church calls us to begin "a holy season of prayerful and penitential reflection," when "our attention is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ."

The words used in the Ash Wednesday rite of the *Lutheran Service Book Agenda* also remind us that "from ancient times the season of Lent has been kept as a time of special devotion, self-denial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on His Word and draws from it life and hope."

Each of the seasons of the church year is observed and celebrated, but Lent, and only Lent, is "kept." The holy season of Lent invites us to be "keepers"—the people of God who keep the fast, keep the silence, and keep the focus throughout this singular season.

This season we will make our way through a series that will take us through some of the most familiar teachings of Jesus from his Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5-7. It will help us relate to the events surrounding Christ's life, death and resurrection. In the process God's Word will reveal that the cross itself is the ultimate sermon on the mount for our journey of faith in this sacred season. We look forward to you joining us for services each Wednesday at 11:00 a.m. and 7:15 p.m.





The things that have changed in my years of teaching always boggles my mind when I start to think of my first years as an early childhood educator. It isn't only what we taught, but also how we taught it. We used to hope that our kiddos would leave preschool knowing the letters in their name which was awesome for the "Ben"s in the group and fairly challenging for the "Christopher"s. Now we not only work on teaching them to remember all uppercase and lowercase letters, but we also work on what sound each letter makes.

We work on recognizing small quantities without counting and ask our kiddos to recall 2 -D and 3-D shapes. This is all while learning to work with a group of same-aged peers and glean from adults that aren't our parents. Preschool is hard work.

BUT...preschool is also the best work. My biggest goal as an educator is not necessarily an academic one. My goal is that each of our preschoolers and our families learn to love the school setting. I hope that our preschoolers grow a desire to try new things and think in new ways. I hope that our families discover the beautiful partnership education can be and use our staff as resources for helping their child develop into the best learner that he or she can be. In this past month, I have had the privilege of partnering with two different early childhood specialists on various tasks related to our work at Share and Care. While sitting and chatting, I have found out that they BOTH attended Share and Care as preschoolers. They now pour THEIR lives' work into early childhood education and I have to imagine the roots of their work find their way back to Share and Care Preschool and the experiences they had while attending here.

Our registration for the 2020-2021 school year has begun for our current families and will be opened to new families on February 3. Our doors will open at 8:55 and spots will be filled on a first come, first served basis. We have offerings in our 2 Day, 3 Day and 5 Day programs for preschoolers who are at least 3 on or before September 15, 2020. Our 5 Day program requires that those preschoolers be 4 on or before September 15, 2020. If you, or anyone you know, is looking for a loving, preschool program that has been part of the community for nearly four decades AND continues to adapt to the most current educational trends, please contact me at share-andcarepreschool@gmail.com. THE PURIFICATION OF MARY AND THE PRESENTATION OF OUR LORD (February 2, 2020)

1 Samuel 1:21–28 Hebrews 2:14–18 Luke 2:22–32 (33–40)

God Gives the Gift of a Child to Destroy Death

The Lord opened the barren womb of Hannah and gave her the gift of the son for whom she prayed, and in grateful response she presented and gave the child, Samuel, to the Lord's service. "As long as he lives, he is lent to the LORD" (1 Sam. 2:28). So, too, did Mary and Joseph present the Child promised from the fall, born of a virgin's womb. The true offering wasn't the turtledoves or young pigeons. It was the Child they carried. This Child has come to "destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery" (Heb. 2:14b–15). Set free by His advent in our flesh and the promise of what He would do "in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people" (Heb. 2:17b), Simeon and Anna rejoiced, and we with them, for we know that we, too, can face death unafraid and "depart in peace" (Luke 2:29) when our time comes.

FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY (February 9, 2020)

Isaiah 58:3-9a 1 Corinthians 2:1-12 (13-16) Matthew 5:13-20

The Righteousness of Christ

Jesus warns that "unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 5:20), but He also calls His imperfect people "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world" (Matt. 5:13, 14). That's because the Lord Jesus came not to abolish the Law or the prophets, "but to fulfill them" (Matt. 5:17) in perfect faith and love. Since He does and teaches all of God's commandments, He is "called great in the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 5:19). God manifests His "demonstration of the Spirit and of power" in "Jesus Christ and him crucified" (1 Cor. 2:2–4), and through the preaching of the Gospel He gives His "secret and hidden wisdom" (1 Cor. 2:7). Christ gives this perfect righteousness to His people, and it leads them to true fasting, which is "to loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo the straps of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free" (Is. 58:6) and "to share your bread with the hungry and bring the homeless poor into your house" (Is. 58:7).

SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY (February 16, 2020)

Deuteronomy 30:15-20 1 Corinthians 3:1-9 Matthew 5:21-37

Christ Sets Life Before Us so that We Can Walk in His Ways

The God who reveals Himself in His incarnate Son promises life and blessing to all who obey His commandments "by loving the LORD your God, by walking in his ways, and by

keeping his commandments and his statutes and his rules" (Deut. 30:16). However, we are "people of the flesh" and "infants in Christ" (1 Cor. 3:1), among whom "there is jealousy and strife" (1 Cor. 3:3). Jesus must instruct us against the human ways of anger, adultery, divorce and false witness (Matt. 5:21–37), because all who live in these ways "shall surely perish" (Deut. 30:18). On the cross, He died to forgive our sins and free us from the ways of curse and death. Since Jesus Christ is our "life and length of days" (Deut. 30:20), we can be reconciled to our brother, live in chastity and marital faithfulness, and speak with honesty. He who serves from His cross also offers His gift of reconciliation at His altar, and we can be at peace with our brothers and sisters in Christ who are "God's field, God's building" (1 Cor. 3:9).

THE TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD (February 23, 2020)

Exodus 24:8–18 2 Peter 1:16–21 Matthew 17:1–9

God Manifests His Glory in the Body of Christ Jesus, Transfigured for Us by His Cross

The Transfiguration confirms "the prophetic word ... to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place" (2 Peter 1:19). The divine glory of Jesus is manifested in the word of His apostles, who were "eyewitnesses of his majesty" (2 Peter 1:16). "He was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun" (Matt. 17:2). Moses and Elijah witnessed the fulfillment of the Old Testament in this Lord Jesus, and the Father testified concerning Him: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matt. 17:5). By His own blood, shed on the cross, Jesus makes and seals the new covenant with us. Hence, "the appearance of the glory of the LORD" is no longer "like a devouring fire" (Ex. 24:17), but it is graciously revealed in His own body. As "Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel" went up the mountain with Moses and "beheld God, and ate and drank" (Ex. 24:9, 11), we also behold the Lord our God in Christ Jesus, and we abide with Him as we eat and drink His body and blood at the altar.

ASH WEDNESDAY (February 26, 2020)

Joel 2:12-19 2 Corinthians 5:20b-6:10 Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

Return to the Lord Your God with All Your Heart, for He Has Reconciled You to Himself

On Ash Wednesday, we come down from the mountain with Jesus and set our face toward His cross and Passion in Jerusalem. We make our pilgrimage with Him by way of repentance, and thus we return to our dying and rising in Holy Baptism. Christ Jesus, "who knew no sin," became our sin, so that by His death we are released from sin and in His resurrection we "become the righteousness of God" (2 Cor. 5:21). As God has thereby reconciled the world to Himself in Christ, "now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor. 6:2). He has provided the sacrificial Lamb, and He has left "a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering" (Joel 2:14) in the Eucharist. He summons us to return to Him with all our heart because He is "gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love" (Joel 2:13). We do so with faith and confidence in Him, and so we pray to Him as our Father, give to the needy from a heart of love, and fast for the sake of repentance (Matt. 6:3–4, 6, 17–18).
